

In Pursuance of an Act of Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania I David Cooke of the Township of Donigal in the County of Lancaster Farmer, Do hereby enter and return that Juliet, a Negro Female Child the Daughter of Negro Rose a Female Slave, was born on the Twelfth Day of April in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety three, And that her said Mother Rose was duly entered & Registered in Lancaster County as a Slave pursuant to the Act for the gradual abolition of Slavery, and that the aforesaid Negro Child Juliet is my Property and liable to serve untill she shall arrive to the age of Twenty eight Years. Witness my Hand the Seventh Day of October in the Year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred & Ninety three.
