Chiefly papers of John R. Haudenshield of Carnegie (1888-1959), member of the Pennsylvania House of Representatives from Allegheny County (Republican), 1939-40 and 1943-59, and member of the Historical and Museum Commission, 1951-56. Also included are a number of printed items added following Haudenshield's death.

Correspondence, genealogical notes, and other manuscript materials; printed items including booklets, brochures, newspaper and magazine articles, and family histories; and a number of photostats and *photographs. A portion of the correspondence is with officials of the Historical and Museum Commission. The papers relate to the history and development of Pittsburgh and surrounding areas of southwestern Pennsylvania; more general aspects of Pennsylvania history; various people and places of interest, both inside and outside the United States; and genealogical matters including lineage and military service.
