Correspondence of William Jessup (b. 1797, d. 1868) a Montrose lawyer since 1818. From 1838-51 he was presiding judge of the 11th judicial district. In April 1861 he was one of the committee of three sent by the governors of Penna., Ohio and N.Y. to confer with President Lincoln about the raising of 75,000 men. He was chief founder of the county agricultural Society.
