

WILLIAM W. SCRANTON PAPERS

William Warren Scranton (1917-), Governor of Pennsylvania from 1963 to 1967, was a prominent businessman, civic leader, politician, and diplomat. A native of the family-founded city of Scranton, he graduated from Yale University in 1936 and Yale Law School in 1946. After service as a pilot in World War II, he played an important role in the revitalization of Scranton's economy. In 1959 he was appointed Special Assistant to the Secretary of State and represented the United States at several international conferences. He was elected Republican congressman from the Tenth District in 1960 and Governor of Pennsylvania in 1962. He entered the 1964 presidential race but lost the nomination to Barry Goldwater. After leaving the governorship in 1967, he served on several presidential commissions. President Gerald Ford appointed him United Nations Ambassador in 1976.

Papers are those of Scranton while governor (1962-1967). The collection contains the following series: General File, 138 cu. ft.; Subject File, 90.5 cu. ft.; Legislative Files, 33 cu. ft.; House and Senate Bills Signed, 10.5 cu. ft.; Legislative Office, 18 cu. ft.; Boards and Commissions File, 15 cu. ft.; Press Releases, 13 cu. ft.; End of Administration File, 1 cu. ft.; and records from the offices of several of the governor's secretaries and aides.

The collection contains a large general correspondence file and a large subject file. These records contain information on the following agencies, issues, subjects, and events: bible reading in schools, the Conference of Appalachian Governors, Constitutional Revision Commission, civil defense, Delaware River regulatory agencies, civil and labor disturbances, economic development, education, executive directives, the General State Authority, governor's conferences and committees, highways and highway safety, housing, Human Relations Commission, interstate commissions, personnel and job files, functions at the Governor's Mansion, mental health, milk control, national highway program, the presidential campaigns of 1964 and 1968, Project 70, Republican party and campaign politics, the state sales tax, status of women, transportation, unemployment compensation, Vietnam, water conservation, stream purification, flood control, and executive departments, boards, and commissions under the governor's jurisdiction.

The legislative files consist of bill histories, correspondence, opinions of the Attorney General, and vetoes of various pieces of legislation. A companion file is the House and Senate bills signed by Scranton. Information provided includes dates when received, opinions, dates signed and passed, amendments, and the printer's number. Some bills are also accompanied by photos of the signing. Records of the Legislative Office (1963-1967), directed by

Legislative Secretary James Reichley (1929-), contain materials on Scranton's 1964 presidential campaign (3 cu. ft.), files on departmental legislation (2 cu. ft.), the Special Legislative Session of 1964 (1 cu. ft.), and a subject file (12 cu. ft.), that includes a large number of clippings on political figures and issues.

The Boards and Commissions File is concerned with appointments, mainly with letters of application and recommendation (11 cu. ft.) and Justices of the Peace and Aldermen (4 cu. ft.). The End of Administration File, divided into a general and a subject file, deals mostly with miscellaneous records for the year 1967.

The records of Jack L. Conmy, Press Secretary (1963-1967), consist of a category file (10 cu. ft.), departmental lists (3 cu. ft.), and general files (2.5 cu. ft.), Press releases (13 cu. ft.) relating to appointments, elections, executive directives, greetings, proclamations, speeches, and public statements cover the period from his 1962 campaign to the end of his term in 1967. The records of William D. Johnson, Assistant Secretary to the Governor (1963-1967), consist of letters of application and recommendation for appointment (8 cu. ft.), William G. Murphy's files (.6 cu. ft.), the Secretary to Governor Scranton (1962-1967), include general correspondence and departmental lists. A general file (2 cu. ft.) from the office of Robert C. McCormick, Public Information Specialist (1963-1967), is also included within the collection.
