JACOB J. BIERER COLLECTION, 1795-1907

Jacob J. Bierer was born in Westmoreland County, February 16, 1830, became a carpenter, later sold real estate and insurance. He served in the Civil War as a Captain, Company C, 11th Regiment Pennsylvania Volunteers from November 1861 to April 1864 and was wounded in the second battle of Bull Run. He served several terms as school director of Latrobe borough and was chief burgess in 1860, 1862 & 1882. He was elected to the Pennsylvania House of Representatives as a Democrat in 1883 and again in 1891. He was also commissioned as a notary public in 1886 and 1901. He was married to Catherine H. Bierer and had three children. Irving Bierer died February 13, 1891 at age 24 years, 3 months and 24 days. His daughter Myra Myrtle married George Delaney and Eliza married John Schall. Jacob died on September 2, 1902.
