



Surveyed on the 28 day of March 1734 to Jeremiah Starr a Certain Tract of Land Situate on a Branch of the River Skulkill called Undanihilea in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at an Ash tree being a Corner of Nehemiah Nuttons land thence by the same South East one hundred & Seventy perches to a Small hickery thence by Vacant land South <sup>Degrees</sup> Sixty West five hundred perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North West one hundred and Seventy perches to a Black Oak Saplin thence by Vacant land North Sixty Degrees East five hundred Perches to the Place of beginning containing four hundred Acres with Usual Allowance
