



A Tract of Land situate in Upper Milford Township, in the County of Northampton formerly Bucks and Province of Pennsylvania. Being Part of a Tract of 38<sup>ac</sup> 142 perches of Land, and the allowance. That formerly was Surveyed unto John Koocken in Pursuance of a Warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries Dated on the 18<sup>th</sup> May Anno 1750. granted to John Miller, who sold and assigned his Right to the same, on the back of the said Warrant unto the said John Koocken, who sold and Conveyed his Right to the same to his son Henry Koocken, by Agreement of the 4<sup>th</sup> September 1761. who again sold and assigned the same to Christian Miller on the 22<sup>d</sup> January 1765. who also now Sold and Conveyed the above to John Shout By Agreement of the 19<sup>th</sup> Novemb. 1768. - Beginning at a Stone a Corner of the said John Shouts other Land. Thence by the same South 60 perches to a Stone, set for a Corner of Martin Werffels Land. Thence by the same West 44 perches to a Stone, set for a Corner of Anthony Stehlers Land. Thence by the same North 11<sup>deg</sup> 20<sup>min</sup> East 67<sup>7/10</sup> perches to a Stone in the Line of Henry Bittings Heirs (now belonging to his Heirs) Thence by the same East 32 perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing fourteen Acres and forty Perches of Land - or Thirteen Acres and seventy one Perches of Land, together with the usual Allowance at six percent for Roads Surveyed for the said John Shout on the 2<sup>d</sup> November Anno. 1768
