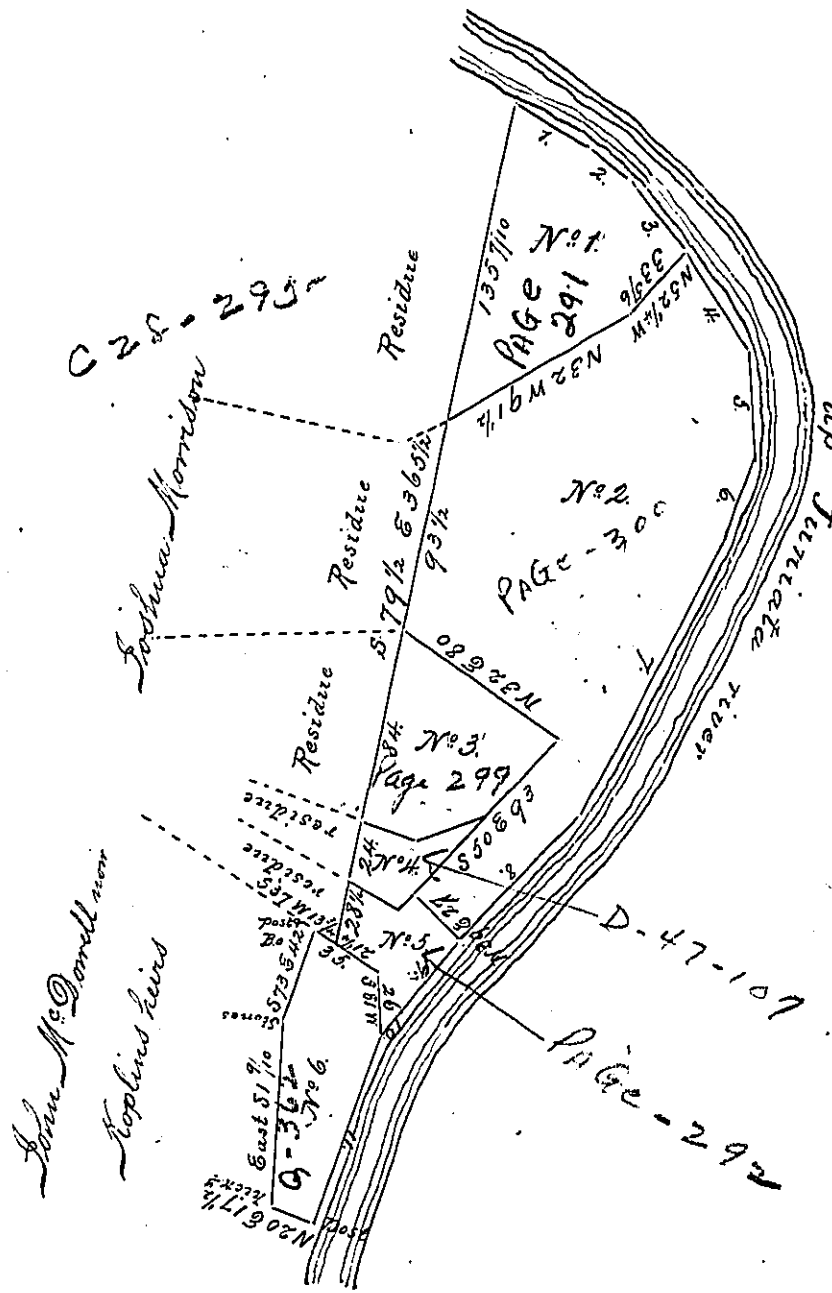

N^o 5. is part of N^o 3 containing 9^a 131 part of 83^a 124 Surveyed on Hart to John Carmichael dated 29th April 1776.

N^o 6. Containing 22-52 Surveyed 14th Oct 1790 Hart to John Carmichael dated 15th July 1790 - All which appears to have been resurveyed and divided for Joshua Morrison & William Morrison in January 1815 & 1817. Examined 31st March 1823
