



A Draught of a Tract of Land called the Sleeping Place situate on the Path leading from Chincleanouche to the great Island including a Spring and a number of Indian Camps by the Path about ten Miles Eastward from Clearfield Creek and three or four from the west Branch of Susquehanna adjoining Lands of Thomas Harrison supposed to be in the County of Northumberland containing three hundred and twelve acres three Quarters of an Acre and the usual Allowance of six & Cent for Roads &c Surveyed the 5<sup>th</sup> Day of July 1773 for Jehu Eldridge in pursuance of a Warrant granted to him the 14<sup>th</sup> Day of May in the same year
