



A Draught of a Tract of Land called the Briary Spring situate about three Miles and an half Northward from the Mouth of Quemahoning on the heads of a Run which empties into the West side of Stony Creek about six Miles below the Mouth of Quemahoning aforesaid in Brothers Valley Township in the County of Bedford containing three hundred and four Acres and the usual Allowance of six & Cent. for Roads be Surveyed the 28<sup>th</sup> Day of Sept: 1770 for William Counsel in pursuance of an Ord. (~~.....~~) the 2<sup>th</sup> Day of April 1769.
