



In pursuance of an Order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16th day of June 1832 a survey was made on the 5th day of July following a certain Lot of Ground in the Town of Dunbury in the County of Northumberland numbered in the general Plan of said Town Two hundred and thirty eight and granted to John Sanders, containing in Breadth East and West sixty feet and in length North and South two hundred and thirty feet, bounded Westward by Lot number Two hundred and thirty nine, Southward by Peashberry Street, Eastward by Lot number Two hundred and thirty seven and Northward by Gooseberry alley, by the general Plan of said Town remaining in the Surveyor Generals office will appear. —
