



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 8th day of ^{June} (1732) Dom 1738. Surveyed on the 5th day of June Anno Dom. 1740. To John (1732) A Tract of Land Situate in the Township of Pasading in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at White Oak thence North 80 degrees west 220 yds to a post, thence South 10 Degrees West 160 yds to a post thence South 80 degrees East 290 yds, to a post, thence North 35 yds to Hickory, thence North west 48 yds. to White Oak thence North 47 degrees west 28 yds. Crossⁿ Passion Creek thence along y^e said creek North 34 degrees West 24 yds to a Spanish Oak, thence North 23 degrees East 257 yds to y^e place of beginning.
