



Situate in New London Township on a Branch of Elk River Chester Co^{ty}
 Survey'd in Pursuance of a Warrant Granted to her Husband William Finney Deceased Dated June 1st 1748, Containing 146 7/8 A. & allow. of 6 P. Ct. for roads. Geo. Churchman
 Note the above alteration was made at the instance of Capt. Finney (to whom the land belongs) in consequence of an Arbitration which he says was held between Morrison & him, when the award was in Morrison's favour, his Survey being much the oldest viz: in 1737 - W^m Montgomery Esq^r being present at the time in the office confirmed the above assertion as he had been one of the Arbitrators.
