



In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the sixth day of November A<sup>o</sup> D<sup>o</sup> 1734 Surveyed to Peter Gubb a certain tract of Land Situate between Tulpehocken & Susquehanna Creek in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a post in a Line of Rich<sup>d</sup> Perris Mammot at a corner of a small piece of Land laid out to Charles Fell and Juliana Maria his wife. Thence extending by the same South ten degrees East two hundred forty perches and a half to a post and South eighty degrees West thirty four perches to a post. Thence by Conrad Sharf's Land South ten degrees East fourteen perches & three quarters to a post and North eighty degrees East ninety eight perches and a half to a post. Thence by Vacant Land North <sup>ten</sup> eighty degrees West two hundred fifty five perches and a quarter to a post, thence by Rich<sup>d</sup> Perris Mammot South eighty degrees West sixty four perches and a half to the place of Beginning. Containing One hundred acres and the usual allowance for Roads. &c. Surveyed the twenty eighth day of October A<sup>o</sup> D<sup>o</sup> 1735.
