N^o 13. the Small piece Dotted from the P.O. to the Jackoak. Contains 4 Acres and 28 perches & allowance & is said to be Patented land and Patented to James Hughes in June 1792. It was called on by James Hughes to Survey ~~to survey~~ a small piece of Land for Abraham Scott which Hughes said he had Run in his Survey and had agreed to Give it up to said Scott which settled all Disputes Between them in Regard to their Land Disputes the above 100 Acres. Strict Measure Was first sold by Abraham Scott To a James Carmichel. By Carmichel to Richard Gregg. Carmichels Administrators Brought Suit against Scott for the Land and then Referred it to men who Made and Settled the above Butts and Bounds and Was Confirmed by the Court
