I Wilson King Deputy Surveyor in and for the County of Erie do hereby Officially certify and make known That at the time of surveying the above described tract of land the s^d Jas. Carroll was actually residing on and engaged in improving the same and from the Books or documents in my Office the above land does not appear to have been Granted to any person Other than the s^d Jas. Carroll by Warrant or otherwise. It appears from information however that W^m and Jas. Benson as heirs of the late Isaac Benson deceased claim a part of s^d land and that my predecessor Jonah Corrill Esq^r has surveyed s^d land for s^d Bensons but such survey is not noted on the Survey Book — the residue of s^d larger tract of land has been sold for taxes by the Commissioners of this County. I have shown by dotted lines where Bensons Claim and Carrolls Interfere
