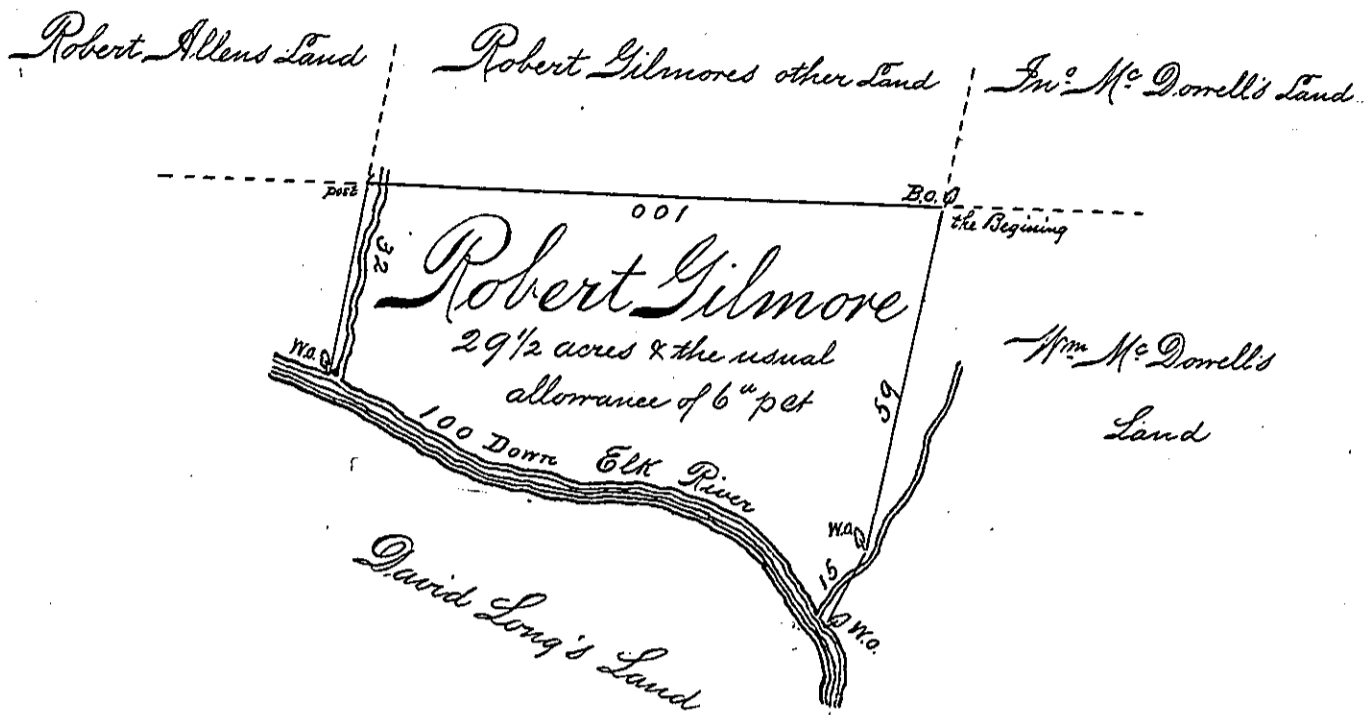

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietors as  
Bearing Date the 9<sup>th</sup> of March A. D. 1744 Survey'd  
to Robert Gilmore the 18<sup>th</sup> of the 2<sup>nd</sup> month 1748  
a tract of Land Situate in New London township  
Chester Co<sup>ty</sup> Beginning at a Blackoak a Corner of  
his other Land & Wm<sup>o</sup> Mc Donnell's Land thence by his  
other Land North West by West 100 p<sup>s</sup> to a Post thence  
South West 32 Perches to a White Oak standing on the East  
Side of Elk River thence Down the several Courses of the said  
River 100 Perches to a White Oak thence North 61° Easterly 15 Perches to a White Oak thence  
North East by Wm<sup>o</sup> Mc Donnell's Land 59 p<sup>s</sup> to the Place of Beginning Containing 29 1/2 & the  
allowance of 6<sup>th</sup> p<sup>er</sup> Ct for Roads &c
