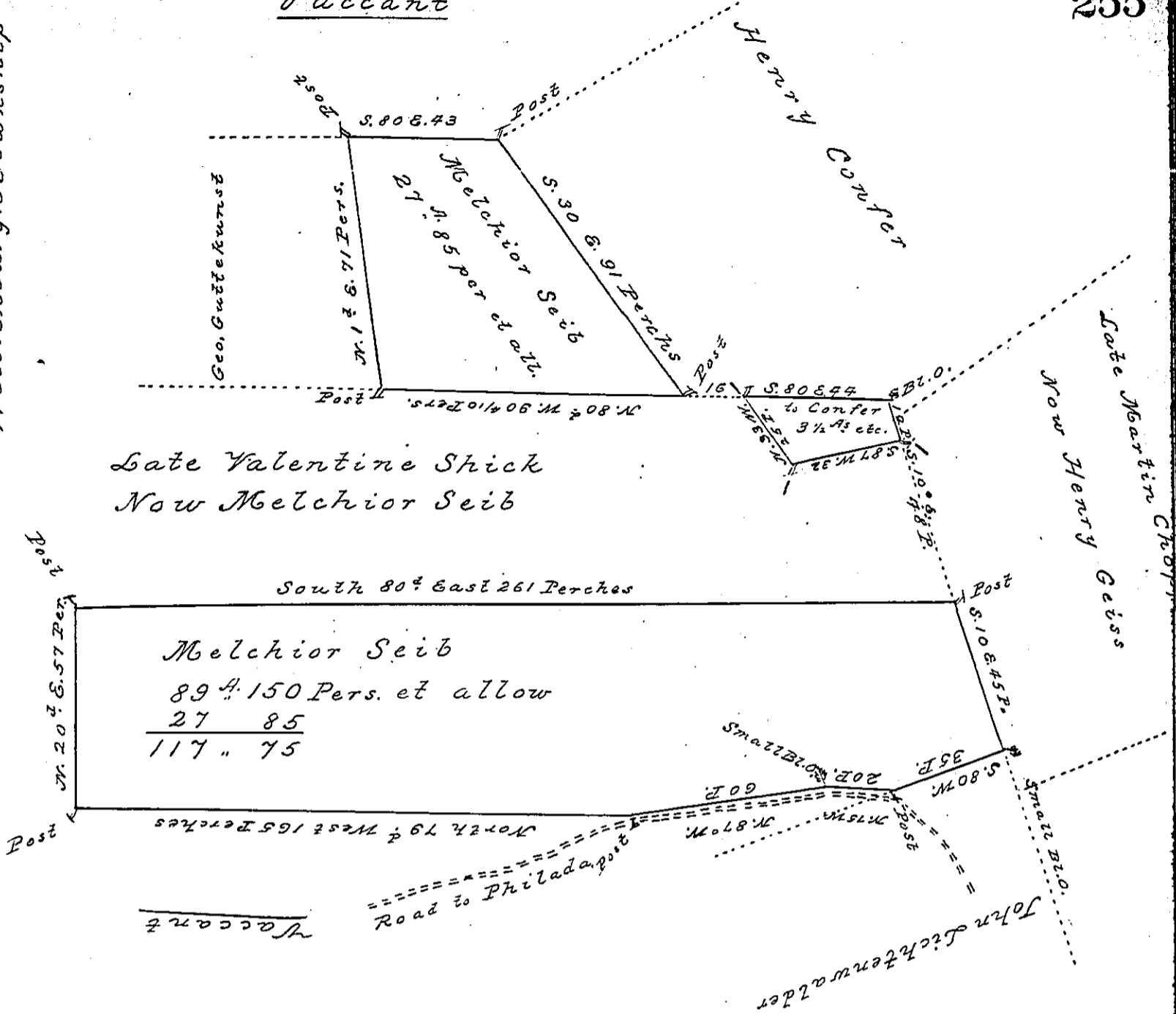

By Virtue of a Warrant Dated at Philadelphia on the 31st Day of August Anno. 1750. granted to John Gale the above described Two Tracts of Land, the largest is Situate in Maccory Township and the Smallest in Weissenburgh Township in the County of Northampton and Province of Pennsylvania — The one containing Eighty nine Acres and 150 Perches of Land with the usual Allowance, and the other Contains Twenty Seven Acres and 85 perches with the Allowance. Both together contain one hundred and Seventeen Acres and 75 Perches together with the usual Allowance at Six per Cent for Roads were Surveyed for Melchior Seib on the 22^d Day of May Anno. 1755. — By order of Mr. William Parsons Esquire

Notandum. The warrant was formerly given to Henry Confer Esqrs Surveyor.

Notandum. The above described Small Tract of Three and one half Acres with the Allowance, was then agreed and sold by the said Melchior Seib to his Neighbour Henry Confer to whose draught the said Piece is added which was cut of from his old Tract.
