



In pursuance of a warrant dated the nineteenth day of October 1762, Surveyed for Richard Tea a certain Tract of Land situate in Germanak Township below Jacks Narrows in the County of Cumberland, Beginning at a white oak and from thence extending by other Land of the said Richard Tea the three Courses and distances following viz^t South 26 degrees West 104 perches to a white oak, South 18 degrees West 143 perches to a maple, and South 68 degrees West 100 perches to a white oak standing on the bank of Juriala River thence up the same North 30 Degrees West 20 perches to a post a corner of James Ross's Land thence ~~by~~ the same North 27° East ~~176~~ 169 perches to a white oak, 61° North 47° West 50 perches to a post, thence by Vacant Land North 47° East 166 perches to the place of Beginning Containing one hundred and four Acres and three quarters of an Acre and the usual allowance of six Acres of Bent for Roads &c
