



In Pursuance of a Warrant granted to Solomon Jennings for twenty five Acres of land in the County of Bucks (adjoining other land he had lot of John McHickle) bearing ^{date} the 24th day of September 1751 There was Surveyed by James Scull late Deputy Suror the above described Tract of land situate near the great Swamp on the branches of Jones Creek, now in the Coy of Northampton County Containing Eighty eight Acres & a quarter & allowance &c. Drawn in the Suror's Office from a Certificate of said Scull's Field Works - Nov. 22^d 1783.
