



By virtue of a warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing Date the twenty sixth of April Anno Dom<sup>o</sup> 1742 under the Hand of George Thomas Esq<sup>r</sup> Commiss<sup>r</sup> of property I have surveyd and laid unto Peter Johnson in the Township of Hopewell in the County of Lancaster on the west side Susquehanna river one hundred and fifty two Acres of Land with allowance of six Cent Beginning at a Hickory at the Temporary Line a Corn<sup>r</sup> of W<sup>m</sup> Hoagans Land thence North Twenty Degrees Easterly one hundred and fifty five perches to a Post thence South Sixty Degrees Easterly ~~two~~ hundred Twenty nine perches and an half to a Hickory thence South Twenty Degrees Westerly Twenty three perches to a post in the said Temporary Line by the same Westerly to the place of Beginning
