



Draught of a tract of Land situate in the Manor of Springtown in the County of Chester,
now in the possession of David McCandie. Beginning at a marked Chestnut tree, and from
thence extending by Daniel Henderson's Land South forty-two perches to a marked Chestnut
Oak, South thirty-nine Degrees West eighty-seven perches to a stone, and West one hundred and
two perches to a stone, thence by James Scott's Land North thirty Degrees and a half East
fifty perches to a marked white oak, North sixty-one Degrees West eleven perches to a stone,
and North twenty-seven Degrees West sixty-eight perches to a marked Maple tree, thence
by Francis Alexander's Land North eighty-nine Degrees and a half East one hundred and
seventy-four perches to the place of Beginning - Containing Ninety eight acres and
the usual allowance of six acres per cent for Roads &c. Surveyed the 29th Day of September
