



In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the second day of October A.D. 1735 surveyed unto David Jones a Certain Tract of Land situate on a Branch of "Shippacon" Creek called Still Creek adjoining the Land, late, of James Logan Beginning at a marked White Oak in a Line of a Tract of Land laid out to James Logan at a Corner of George Graef's and Michael Hizer's Lands Thence extending by said Hizer's Land East fifty two pches to a marked black Oak at another Corner of said Hizer's Land Thence by Andrew Saltzger's Land North West by North twenty pches to a post and North East one hundred and nine pches to a marked White Oak Thence by John Sells's and George Hriegels Lands North West by North ninety eight pches to a Post Thence by vacant Land South West by West one hundred and fifty pches to a Post thence by said Graef's Land South East by South one hundred and ten pches to the place of Beginning. Containing one hundred Acres and the usual Allowance for Roads &c. Surveyed the 9th Day of October Anno Domini 1735
