The one part thereof included in black lines was Warranted to William Crawford the 16<sup>th</sup> day of July 1773 and Surveyed in pursuance thereof the 22<sup>d</sup> of January 1774 and contains 89 Acres & 107 perches and allowance Part contained in the red lines Warranted in name of Alice Crawford the 26<sup>th</sup> of January 1785 Survey in pursuance thereof the 10<sup>th</sup> day of August 1785 also in pursuance of an Order of the Board granted John Crawford and Elizabeth Russle bearing date the 3<sup>d</sup> day of March 1827 on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the following April And contains 10 Acres and 53 perches and allowance Surveyed this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of December 1830 for the purpose of excluding it from that part of the above mentioned surveys that is to be Patented to Henry Russle Situate in Cumberland Township in the County of Greene John Fordyce D.S. To Jacob Spangler Esq<sup>r</sup> Surveyor Gen<sup>l</sup> of Pennsylvania
