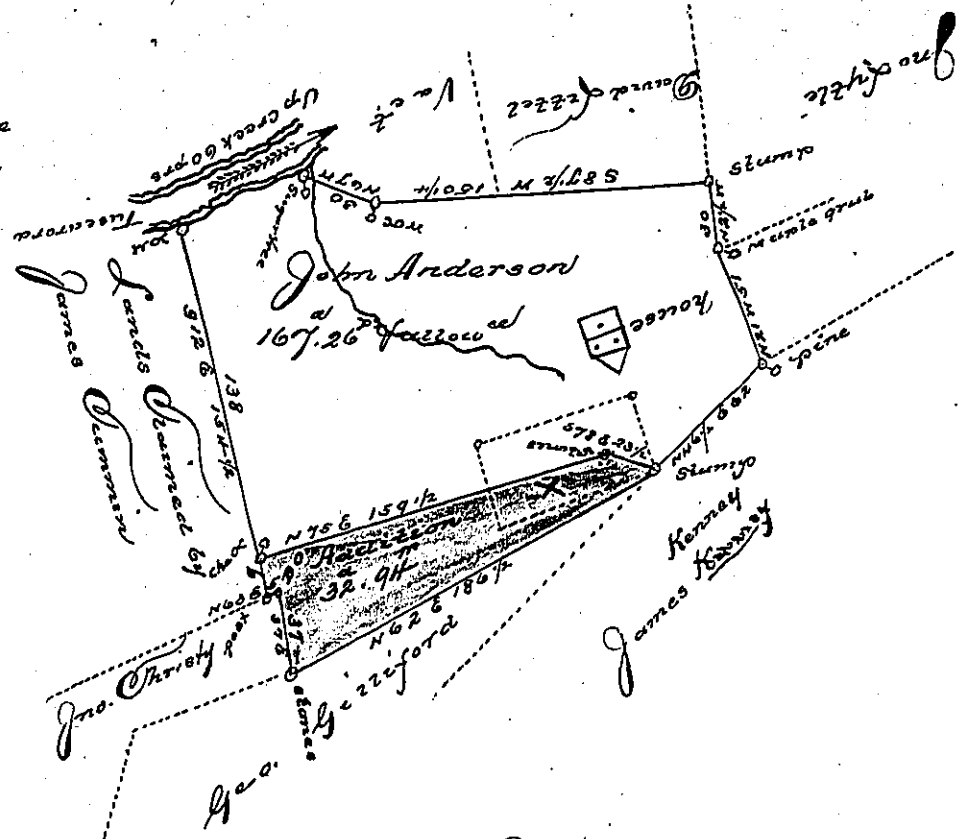


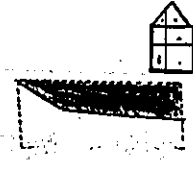

A Draught of a tract of Land Situate in Miford Township (formerly Cumberland) now Mifflin County appears, Surveyed for John Anderson and said to contain 160 1/2 acres and the allow^{ance} of 6^{feet} Cent for Roads in pursuance of an Application granted for 200 acres bearing date the 15th day of Dec^r 1766 No 1236.

Resurveyed the 2^d of Dec^r 1801 and appears to contain one hundred and ninety nine acres and 120 perches and the allowance of six feet Cent for Roads & including an addition of 32 acres & 9 1/4 perches & made at the same time by virtue of an order of Resurvey of the above Tract, from the Board of Property, in favor of Mr. Rob^t Woods. of Mifflin. Dated 21st of August 1801.

Notes The part Colored Green on the above Draught represents the addition of 32^{acres} & 9 1/4^{perches} and is made agreeable to the lines of the adjacent Surveys.
