



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the twenty seventh day of February 1733 Surveyed unto Owen Richard a Tract of Land Situate in Oley in the County of Berks Beginning at a White Oak Corner of George Hinton's land thence by the same North Twenty Degrees East one hundred and six perches and the same course by Vacant Land one hundred and thirty four perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South seventy Degrees East one hundred and ninety two perches to a Hickory thence by Vacant Land South twenty Degrees West one hundred and two perches to a post thence by Land of Peter Hilton North Seventy Degrees West sixty two perches to a Black Oak thence by the said Hiltons Land South twenty Degrees West Eighty perches to a post thence North seventy Degrees West by land of Solomon Cole Sixty perches to a post a Corner of S. Coles Land thence by the same South twenty Degrees West fifty eight perches to a White Oak in the line of Mordcaai Lincoln's Land thence by the same North Seventy Degrees West Seventy perches to the place of Beginning Containing Two hundred acres with the usual allowance of six Percent
