



James Tregoe vs. Richard Crouch

In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Dated
the 20th Day of July 1737 Reservining unto James Tregoe a
Small Tract of Land in Whiteland Township in the County of Ches-
ter (so^d forty five acres) being part of a larger Tract formerly de-
cided to the Executor of Thomas Lloyd deceased, I have Reservined unto the
sd. James Tregoe on the 26. day of the Month of July this sd small
Tract of land Situate in the sd Township of Whiteland Beginning at
a white Oak at a corner of David Jenkins Land Thence South Nine deg-
rees East by the same 112 Pches to a post Thence E.N.E. by other land of
the sd James Tregoe & the land of Richard Euclidson 142 pches to a post
Thence North eight degrees west by the land of Richard Richardson 112
pches to a post Thence W.S.W. by the land late of William Crouch and the land of
the sd David Jenkins 144 pches to the place of Beginning Containing in the
whole Ninety acres and a half besides the usual Allowance for Roads, that is to
say fifty acres which the sd James claims Title to under the Executor
of the sd Thomas Lloyd, and forty acres and a half is the quantity
of Overplus within the known lines and bounds of the sd small
Tract
