



Isaac Taylor's Land situated on a branch of Octoraro Creek in the Township of Sadbury in the County of Chester part of one Thousand acres granted by the Commissioners Warrant dated the 23^d day of March 1713/4 ~

Begins at a corner marked White Oak being a corner of George Pierce's Land thence North 75^o Easterly by Vacant Land 19 Pches to a Black Oak thence North by the Land of John Powell Samuel Robinson 232 Pches to a post thence West by South by Vacant Land 160 Pches to a post thence South by East fifty nine perches to a post thence West by South Seventy two Pches to a post thence South by East by the Land of the sd George Pierce 112 Pches to the place of beginning Containing two Hundred & fifty acres and the Allowance of six acres P Cent for Roads ~ Survey'd the 23rd of March 1714
