



The above Survey containing Three hundred Twenty acres and hundred and two perches with allowance of six acres p. Cent; for Road is Situated in Turbutt Township, Northumberland County; appears to have been made the 25<sup>th</sup> of June last, by the direction of W<sup>m</sup> De Witt then Deputy Surveyor. In pursuance of an Order of Survey to John Love dated at Philadelphia the Fifth day of July Anno Dom 1769. N<sup>o</sup> 3612, which I am informed, calls exactly for the above Land, This survey includes almost entirely one lately made for John Dunlap as will appear by the dotted lines. Should Love's Order appear to take the above Land, I then think, that this survey ought to be accepted, and Dunlap's rejected, a matter which is submitted to the Surveyor General.
