



The tract represented by the plane lines in the above diagram was surveyed to William M<sup>o</sup> Dowell on the 5<sup>th</sup> of May 1772 By order of the 3<sup>d</sup> April 1769. No 1980 That part represented by the dotted line and the letters A. B. & C. was surveyed to Thomas M<sup>o</sup> Crea on the 26<sup>th</sup> of March 1787 By Warrant of the 26<sup>th</sup> August 1785. That part represented by the dotted lines and the letters D. E. & F. was surveyed to Thomas M<sup>o</sup> Crea on the 26<sup>th</sup> of March 1787. By warrant of the 9<sup>th</sup> March 1787. Examined and ascertained the above interference on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of December 1827 in pursuance of the several Acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Location or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary Government and by the authority of the Board of Property. The tracts warranted in the name of M<sup>o</sup> Crea are owned by William Trimble and in the occupancy of John Asey whose buildings and improvements are principally included within M<sup>o</sup> Dowells Survey.
