



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Honble Proprietaries bearing Date the 17<sup>th</sup> Day of January Anno Domini 1737 I have Surveyed & laid unto George Leonard in the Township of Hope-well in the County of Lancaster on the West Side Susquehanna River Three hundred and Thirty Nine acres of Land with allowance of Six Percent Beginning at a black oak Thence South Twenty Degree Westerly Three hundred and three Pches to a post standing in the line of Saml Jones Esq<sup>r</sup> Then by the sd Land South Seventy Degrees Easterly one hundred and nine Pches to a White-oak Corner of the sd Jones's Land Thence North Twenty Degrees Easterly Three hundred and three Pches to a white-oak in the line of Land of Nathaniel Newlin Thence by the sd Land North Seventy Degrees Westerly one hundred and Ninety Pches to the Place of Beginning Survey'd January 25<sup>th</sup> 1737
