



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate in Upper Meriopolis Township, in the County of Northampton, in the State of Pennsylvania, Containing Seventeen acres and 116 Perches of Land, together with the usual Allowance at six per cent for Roads... That was formerly surveyed for Anthony Reishel on the 12<sup>d</sup> November, 1755, But soon after he gave up his Right to the same to his Brother Michael Reishel, and caused another Tract to be surveyed to him, in Right of his warrant. Afterwards, the Heirs of the said Michael Reishel deceased, sold and conveyed their Right to the above (as well as to all their other Land,) to George Shroyer. Who again in the year 1773, sold and conveyed the same to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Jacob Van Buskirk.

Formerly surveyed, and now drawn for the said Jacob Van Buskirk By Order of the Surveyor General, on the 12<sup>d</sup> January Anno. 1782.
