



Situate on the waters of the Raysstown Branch of the Juniata River in Hopewell Township now Sed Huntingdon County, Containing four hundred acres & allowance &c first surveyed on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of April 1794 in pursuance of a warrant dated March 31<sup>st</sup> 1794 by John Canan the then Deputy Surveyor of said County the lines retraced and some corrections made interferences excluded on the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> days of November A.D. 1852 in pursuance of an Order of a Resurvey granted to the Trustees and Divisees of the estate of John Savage Dec<sup>d</sup> dated the 6<sup>th</sup> day of October A.D. 1838
