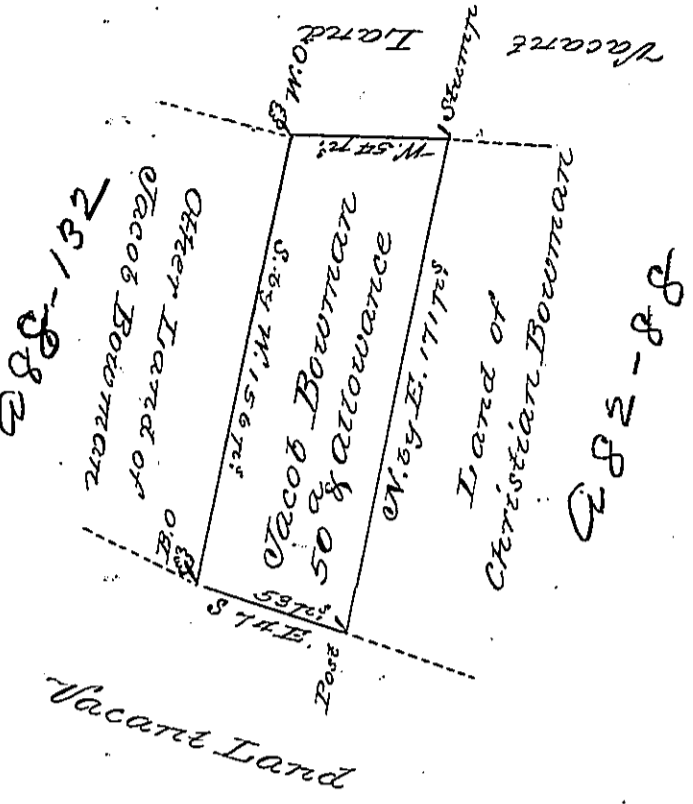


Warrant dated 8 Oct 1745
