



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the 29th. of March Anno Domini 1738. The above Described Tract of Land was surveyed to Lawrence Thomson. In the County of Lancaster & Township of Turpehocken. Beginning at a stone in a line of Thomas Cooper, Thence <sup>North</sup> South 50 degrees East by the same & Vacant Land 108 pps to a Chestnut Oak Jo: Containing 166 ft. & Varrowance of six qrs. Ct. for Roads, Surveyed the 29th of the 2 mo. 1738.
