Originally surveyed by Charles Lukens late d. S. on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of August Anno Domini 1765. In pursuance of a Warrant for 100 a. granted to Joseph Smith bearing date the 10<sup>th</sup> day of December 1758. Resurveyed by John Forsyth late d. S. on the 21<sup>th</sup> of February 1786. And now after Having Calculated, Examined & Corrected the same; I am desired by the present owner John Ferret to make Return of the Draught the 29<sup>th</sup> day of August A. D. 1809.
