Bounded by Jesse Spencer on the West, on the North by residue land formerly of David Ferguson, on the East by land of James Wall, and on the South by the West branch of the Susquehanna River. Surveyed for James Ferguson Esq. Adm<sup>r</sup> of David Leggett dec<sup>d</sup> (by virtue of his warrant dated the 8<sup>th</sup> day of January A.D. 1811) on the 2<sup>nd</sup> March 1811
