



Surveyed to John Jenkins the above Described Tract of land on the 23 day of June 1787 containing Three Hundred ninety nine acres and one hundred and sixty perches with the usual allowance of Six per Ct. Situated and lying on a Small Run that Emptys in the Allegheny River About ten miles above the mouth of Tobys Creek, and adjoining lands surveyed for Franklin College, in pursuance of a Warrant granted him from the Land Office for four Hundred acres the seventeenth day of May One thousand Eighty five, number two hundred and eighty late purchase No. 100 Humboldt County
