



Situate on the East side of Monongahela River in Leasene & German Townships Fayette County and Surveyed the 26th day of February 1806 In pursuance of a Warrant dated 11th April 1797*.

Note, when I went to survey this land I had forgot to take the warrant with me, on my return & on examination I found two warrants one for 400^{ac} dated 13th Sept. 1792. Interest from date, @ 50^{ts} per Cent, it is said I formerly refused to execute it on the ground - I found another of 200^{ac} at 10^{per} Cent for part of the same. Interest to commence from 1st March 1790, dated 11th April 1797. Although the owner is a poor Man "deceased by affliction in a great measure," yet I conceive it my duty, in all cases of like kind, to state the Circumstances. I think neither of them right, the land must have been improved near 18 years before the date of Interest in the last mentioned Warrant. But as the people in that quarter, if not actually driven from their habitations by the Enemy, were almost equally distressed in relief of those that were ~~XXXX~~ I would recommend the circumstances recommend lenity toward them.
