


The Above Described Lands in the Township of Sadsbury in Chester County were Surveyed by Saml Brightfoot by Warrant Granting either of the said ^{Parsons} Liberty to include their Improvements. But as there had been a Debate long Subsisting between Parties holding said Lands they had so Interfered in Clearing Land that it was not practicable to save each Improvement Intire. The two Pricked Lines were Run and Marked Endeavouring to Satisfie the Parties before the Quantities were known on both Sides. Betty's Claim extends to the East of either of said Lines & Dickey goes Considerable to the West of either of them.

Saml Brightfoot

Saml Brightfoot is of Opinion that Betty should have the Whole 155 1/2 a & Return'd William Betty's 158 1/2 a after showing it to the Secretary for his Approbation the 24th Aug: 1743 -

Dickey is D: 1. 4. 6.
