



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Honble Proprietaries bearing Date the third Day of December Anno Dⁿⁱ 1740 I have Surveyed and laid out a John Day in the Township of ~~Manchester~~ in the County of Lancaster on the west Side Susquehanna River Three hundred and seven acres of Land with allowance of six Percent Beginning at a Locust a Corner of Nathan Husseys Land Thence West Eighty six Perches to a Post Thence North seventy four perches to a Hickery by Fishing Creek then up the same fifty perches to a White oak Thence North six Degrees Westerly fifty eight perches to a Chestnut Oak Thence North Sixty two Degrees Westerly to a Gum by the same Creek and thence upon the several Courses thereof About one hundred and Eighty perches to a Spanish Oak Thence North seventy seven Degrees Easterly Two hundred and forty Perches to a Red Oak Thence North fifteen Degrees Westerly fifty one perches to a Hickery Thence North fifty one Degrees Easterly to a Hickery by the said river Thence Down the same Near about four hundred and thirty perches to the place of Beginning Surveyed May 20th 1741.
