



Situate in Shrewsbury Township York County, containing within the black lines, as above set forth, fifty acres, one hundred and twenty perches and Allowance of six per cent for Roads &c<sup>a</sup> being part of a larger tract of 68 as 35 prs & allowance, which was originally surveyed by William Hershey late U.S. on the 29<sup>th</sup> of the 4<sup>th</sup> Month 1793 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Andrew Smith for 75 as dated 26<sup>th</sup> October A.D. 1791 The above part resurveyed and divided off from the said larger tract the 5<sup>th</sup> day of October 1821 at the request of Christian Hershey the present owner of said tract, who desires the same to be returned for confirmation
