



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the eighth of January 1733 Surveyd unto George Eby's the 24th of the same month A Tract of Land situate on a Branch of Conestogoe Creek in Lancaster County, Beginning at a Black Oak being a corner of Henry Landus's Land thence S. East by Vacant Land 160 poles to another Black Oak Then by Christian Stoner's Land E. by N. 72 poles to a Black Oak North by West 12 poles to a Black Oak by the S^d Branch then up the same 12 poles to a White Oak Thence North 30^d West by vacant Land & the Land of Abraham Wolf 216 poles to a Black Oak, thence S. S. West by the Land of the S^d Henry Landus 174 poles to the place of Beginning Containing one Hundred and fifty acres & the allowance of six acres & 2 Cent -
