



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietor dated the 18th of October Anno Domini 1737 the above described Tract of Land was surveyed unto Moses Embere in Robinson Township in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Chestnut Tree. Thence South 63° East by Vacant Land 70 perches to a White Oak. Thence North 27° by 1/2° S. Vacant Land 34 perches to a Hickory. Thence South 63° East by y<sup>e</sup> same land 80 perches to a small Hickory. Thence North 27 Deg<sup>s</sup> East by Vacant Land 166 perches to a post. Thence North 63 Deg<sup>s</sup> West by Vacant Land 150 perches to a Stone. Thence South 27 Deg<sup>s</sup> West by the Land of Rees Philipps and Vacant Land 200 perches to y<sup>e</sup> Place of Beginning. Containing One Hundred and sixty acres beside y<sup>e</sup> allowance of six 1/2 Cent for Roads.
