



By Virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the ^{seventh} Twenty ~~seventh~~ day of April 1734 Surveyed to John Houston a Tract of Land situate on the East side of the River Schuylkill in the county of Philad. Beginning at a Birch tree on the bank of the said river thence by Vacant Land North sixty degrees East two hundred perches to a Maple tree thence by Vacant Land South thirty degrees East one hundred and twenty six perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South sixty degrees West two hundred perches to a Black Oak on the Bank of the River thence up the same to your place of Beginning. Containing one hundred and fifty acres with the usual allowance of six per cent
