



Surveyed on the 3^d day of April 1734 to Burget Hayman a certain Tract of Land situate in New Coweschoopin in the County of Philadelphia. Beginning at a post a Corner of George Weigars Land thence by the same North forty degrees East one hundred & fifty perches to a post a Corner of said Weigars Land thence by land of Jacob Fisket & Vacant Land North fifty degrees West one hundred & thirteen perches to a post. thence by Vacant Land South forty degrees West one hundred & fifty perches to a small Hickery sapling in the line of the Mannor of John Penn Esqr. thence by the same South fifty degrees East one hundred & thirteen perches to a place of Beginning Containing One hundred acres with usual allowance
