



By Virtue of a warrant from the Honorable Proprietaries bearing Date the \_\_\_\_\_ Day of \_\_\_\_\_ Anno Dom \_\_\_\_\_ I have surveyed and laid out unto Thomas Fisher in the Township of Pennsboro in the County of Lancaster on the west side of Susquehanna four hundred and two acres of Land with allowance of six per Cent: Beginning at a Walnut Tree near a small branch thence South forty Degrees Easterly one hundred and eighty five Perches to a Post thence north seventy four Degrees Easterly four hundred and four perches to a post white oak thence north forty Degrees westerly one hundred and eighty five Perches to a white oak <sup>by Stearns Jones Settlements</sup> thence South seventy four Degrees westerly four hundred and four Perches to the place of Beginning. Surveyed June the 4<sup>th</sup> 1752
