



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing date the third Day of October Anno Dom<sup>ini</sup> 1738 I have surveyed and laid out unto Adam Jarney on a branch of Little Conewago in the County of Lancaster on the west side Susquehanna river Two hundred and twenty three acres ~~with~~ <sup>of said</sup> with allowance of six per cent. Beginning at white oak a corn<sup>r</sup> of other land of said Jarney's thence north sixty degrees easterly thirty perches to a post thence south thirty degrees easterly one hundred and fifty perches to a post thence south sixty degrees westerly one hundred perches to a Hickory thence south thirty degrees westerly sixty eight perches to a white oak thence north eighty three Deg<sup>rs</sup> westerly fifty two perches to a post thence south sixty Deg<sup>rs</sup> westerly fifty five perches to a white oak thence north thirty degrees westerly one hundred and forty perches to a post thence north sixty degrees easterly one hundred seventy six perches to a Spanish Oak thence north forty seven degrees & easterly fifty one perches to the place of Beginning & &
