



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietors dated the Twenty seventh day of February 1733 surveyed into John Cassara a tract of Land situate in Oley in the County of Philada. Beginning at a Black Oak a Corner of Jacob Spinglars Land thence by the same South seventy Degrees West Twenty two perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North Twenty Degrees West one hundred and fifty two perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North Seventy Degrees East one hundred and Twenty two perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South Twenty Degrees East Two hundred perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South Seventy Degrees West one hundred perches to a Black Oak in the line of said Spinglars Land thence by the same North Twenty Degrees West forty eight perches to the Place of Beginning Containing Two hundred ^{and a quarter} acres with the usual allowance of six per Cent -
