



Whereas James Dorrrough on the 9<sup>th</sup> Sept<sup>r</sup> 1787 did obtain a Survey in pursuance of his Warrant dated Aug<sup>r</sup> 24<sup>th</sup> 1786 Situate in Salem Township in the County of Westmoreland and whereas it is said that George Armstrong Esquire purchased one hundred Acres with an Allowance of Six p. Cent of the same Tract and is desirous to Patent the same therefore at the request of the said George Armstrong Esquire I have Surveyed the above described piece of Land containing one hundred Acres and Allowance of Six p. Cent part of the Tract afores<sup>d</sup> Aug<sup>r</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> 1803.
